JOHN 6:60-69

In today's Gospel, Jesus was speaking to His disciples in the synagogue in Capernaum. He was speaking to people who had seen His miracles and wished to know more about Jesus. Jesus told them: "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me, and I live in him". He continued: "This bread comes down from heaven, not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead, but anyone who eats this bread will live forever". Their reaction is recorded in the Gospel reading. They said: "This is intolerable language. How could anyone accept it"? Jesus responded: "Does this upset you"? "What if you should see the Son of Man ascend to where He was before"? Jesus continued: "It is the spirit that gives life; the flesh has nothing to offer. The words I have spoken to you are spirit and they are life". Jesus concluded: "But there are some of you who do not believe".

Jesus challenges us today to believe in Him. Do we believe that the bread and wine during the Mass are transformed into the body and blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ? Do we believe that when we eat the host and drink from the chalice, we are consuming the flesh and blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ? Do we believe that Jesus is present truly, really, and substantially in the Holy Eucharist? Do we believe that through the reception of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist we will receive the gift of eternal life?

If we do believe; this belief is a gift of the Holy Spirit. Our Faith is a gift of the Holy Spirit. As Jesus tells us in today's gospel: "The words I have spoken to you are spirit and they are life". He continues: "This is why I told you that not one could come to me unless the Father allows him".

Many of His disciples left Jesus at this point. Jesus turned to the Twelve and asked them: "What about you, do you want to go away too"? Through the gift and action of the Holy Spirit, Peter responded: "Lord, who shall we go to? You are the message of eternal life, and we believe; we know that you are the Holy One of God".

The first announcement of the Eucharist divided the disciples. The crucifixion of Christ was to scandalize them. The Eucharist and the Cross are stumbling blocks for those without faith. Jesus words are spoken to us today: "Will you also go away"? Through the action of the Holy Spirit, we are invited to receive 'the words of eternal life'. To receive the Eucharist in faith is to receive the gift of Our Lord Himself.
