LUKE 6:39-45 In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us 'Why do you observe the splinter in your brother's eye and never notice the plank in your own'? This appears to be a ridiculous statement that a person could be walking about with a plank of wood in their eye and be commenting about a splinter in the eye of another person! At the heart of this Gospel is our personal relationship with God. If our relationship with God is alive and well, our relationships with other people will also be good. If we have a poor relationship with God, it will adversely affect all the other relationships in our lives.

We are commanded to love the Lord our God with all our hearts, minds and strength and to love our neighbour as ourselves. In loving God, we acknowledge our true state before God. God is the all-powerful and all loving creator of everything in the Cosmos, including ourselves. We can only ever approach God on our knees acknowledging our weakness and sinfulness. Despite our unfaithfulness and selfishness, God loves us totally. God never withdraws His love from us. Out of love for us, God sent His Only Son into the world to die on a cross to be the perfect sacrifice for our sins. There is no sin that cannot be forgiven by God through the death of His Son. If God does not condemn and judge us for our faults, how can we possibly in all fairness, point out the faults of others in our lives? The key to our relationships with others is our relationship with God.
