## LUKE 21:25-28, 34-36

Today, we celebrate the First Sunday in Advent. The word 'Advent' means 'Coming'. In the Gospel from Luke, Jesus tells us that 'we will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory'. We are to 'stand erect; hold our heads high because our liberation is near at hand'. Jesus is speaking of the *Parousia*: The Second Coming of Jesus Christ. Only at the Second Coming will the Kingdom of God be fully completed on earth. At the Second Coming, death and sin will be destroyed forever.

We may not be alive at the Second Coming, but we cannot avoid our personal judgement at the time of our own death. We should not fear judgement from Jesus Christ because He is both our Saviour and Judge. He endured the perfect sacrifice of the Cross in order that we may be forgiven our sins and granted eternal life.

The Priest wears purple vestments during Advent. Purple is the sign of repentance. We light the first candle on the Advent wreath. The first Advent candle is known as the 'candle of hope'. Repentance is the hope in which we surrender our sinful lives to Christ' healing love. The hope that we have in a God that loves us.

Amidst the activity of Christmas season preparations, let us not forgot Our God who loves us. Let us respond to the invitation for repentance in preparation for our personal judgement. There is no better way of responding to the call for repentance or to prepare for the celebrations of Christmas than the Sacrament of Reconciliation – to renew our relationship with Jesus Christ.

CONFRATERNITY OF OUR LADY OF LIGHT SPOUSE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT: I wish to reestablish the Confraternity on the Solemnity of The Immaculate Conception of The Blessed Virgin Mary. The Confraternity was established on 26<sup>th</sup> October 1895 by Cardinal Vaughan, Archbishop of Westminster. The objects of the Confraternity are:

1. To promote a true and tender devotion to Our Lady as the Spouse of the Holy Spirit, and the channel through whom He communicates His gifts and graces.

- 2. To obtain light to practice aright all other devotions of the Church, especially devotion to the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar, to the Holy Spirit, and to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and thereby to promote the sanctification of all the Members of the Confraternity.
- 3. To implore through the intercession of Our Lady of Light, that her Divine Son, the "Light of Light, and her Divine Spouse, the Holy Spirit, "Light of our hearts", may graciously vouchsafe to spread ever more and more the light of the Catholic Faith over the whole world, and especially over England.

Means to obtain the end proposed by the Confraternity:

- 1. The daily recital of the "Morning Offering" prayer of Our Lady of Light, Spouse of the Holy Spirit.
- 2. Prayer to the Holy Spirit, and to His Spouse, Our Lady of Light.
- 3. Attendance at daily Mass, where possible.
- 4. The daily recital of the Rosary.
- 5. Reception of Holy Communion at least once a month, especially on Feasts of Our Lord, of Our Lady, of St Joseph, and the Holy Apostles.

Rules of the Confraternity:

- 1. The "Morning Offering" to be recited daily
- 2. Holy Communion once a month in honour of "Our Lady of Light, Spouse of the Holy Spirit", and for the intentions of all Members.
- 3. To keep a picture of "Our Lady of Light, Spouse of the Holy Spirit", and to have an earnest desire to spread the devotion.

Please apply in writing to Fr Patrick, with your full name, if you wish to formally join the Confraternity. The names of all new members will be written into the original register of members.

BISHOP ALAN ADVENT PASTORAL LETTER: My dear People, on this, the First Sunday of Advent, we embark on a journey together with the Universal Church. Every diocese throughout the world has been invited by Pope Francis to walk the Synodal Pathway. The journey begins now and will conclude in Rome in 2023.

The Holy Father invites us to enter this Synodal Journey, moving towards greater Communion, Participation and Mission within the Church. These three themes reflect both our calling and ultimately our destination as Catholic Christians.

We begin in Advent, a season of listening, reflected in the most perfect example Our Blessed Mother, Mary. Listening was central to the Annunciation. First, God speaks to Mary; she loves God, and she listens to him with an open heart and a willingness to participate in His plan. Later, at the Visitation, Mary cares for and listens to her cousin, Elizabeth. Our Lady shows us what it means to be fully attentive to God and to neighbour.

Now it is our turn. We are being asked to pray together, to talk with, and listen to each other, and to share our dreams for a future Church that is enhanced by communion, participation, and mission.

The Holy Father has made it clear that each diocese ought to tailor the pathway to their unique, local situation and with this in mind I would like to encourage you to undertake this task within your Parish Partnerships. These were established as part of our Stewards of the Gospel process, which led, three years ago in the Advent of 2018 to the publication of our Vision Document: Shaping Our Future.

As a diocese, we now have some experience of collective discernment of the will of the Holy Spirit, as the common theme of listening together runs between the Stewards of the Gospel process and the Synodal Pathway. Pope Francis puts it beautifully, saying, "Our journeying together is what most effectively enacts and manifests the nature of the Church as the pilgrim and missionary People of God".

My hope is that the Synodal pathway will help us to discern and implement our own vision and manifest our missionary nature.

Now I urge you to come together in your parish partnership; to pray and to dream of the future of our church, to listen with care and respect to one another, allowing the Holy Spirit to guide your conversations.

Everyone should be included in this prayerful listening and discernment and there will be notices in your parish bulletin or on social media with further information.

As we journey together in our pilgrimage to the house of God our Father, I invite you to use the Synod Prayer which will be available in print form and also on diocesan and parish web sites. Attributed to St Isidore of Seville (560-636), it has been traditionally

used at Councils and Synods for hundreds of years. This version has been designed specifically for the Church's Synodal Pathway. Please pray it, inviting the Holy Spirit into your busy lives and homes and know that I will be praying for you also. Yours in Christ and Mary, +Alan Williams, sm, Bishop of Brentwood.
